# Fill your 2022 Bucket List in the Cariboo Chilcotin Coast




## **Unique Adventures**

- Boat the <u>Central Coast</u>. See nature up close and tour the coastal waters of the Great Bear Rainforest with experienced boat charter-operators.
- Explore a rugged landscape in search of some of the largest mule deer in the world with a <u>guided</u> <u>hunting expedition</u>.
- Attend an authentic and historic rodeo event Canada Day 2022, when Williams Lake, BC, rolls out the welcome to visitors and competitors alike for the <u>Williams Lake Stampede</u>.

# Adrenaline Thrills

- Go where few, if any, have gone with a <u>flightseeing tour</u> Discover glaciers, waterfalls, mountain lakes, peaks and valleys, hidden fishing spots, hiking and biking trails, and backcountry camping.
- □ Fly/bike the <u>South Chilcotin</u> for pure wilderness singletrack, offering over 200 km (124 mi) of trails traversing meadows and alpine ridges for an epic adventure.
- □ Lay down fresh tracks with limitless runs and vertical on a <u>heli-skiing adventure</u>. Take in champagne powder skiing or boarding, with metres of untouched white gold for a once-in-a-lifetime experience exploring an area larger than the entire Swiss Alps.

### Natural Splendor

- □ Paddle the <u>Bowron Lake Canoe Circuit</u>. Canoe or kayak the 116km (72mi) circuit, made up of 10 lakes, taking 7 to 10 days to complete, or select the shorter, 3 to 4-day loop to connect with nature.
- Immerse yourself in the <u>Great Bear Rainforest</u>. Visit one of the largest intact tracts of coastal temperate rainforest left in the world, the wild, rugged beauty of British Columbia's central coast draws people from around the world for fishing, hiking, kayaking, wildlife viewing and taking in Indigenous culture and history.
- Search for <u>Spirit Bears</u>. The ghostly graceful movements of the reclusive Kermode or "Spirit bears" can be found amidst the emerald old-growth forests of the world's largest coastal temperate rainforest. Considered the <u>rarest bear in the world</u>, a small ship expedition is the best way to spot these elusive creatures.
- □ Camp with bears [https://landwithoutlimits.com/partners/bear-camp/]. Stay in a luxury, safari-style camp perched above the shores of the Chilko River right in the heart of some of the world's best habitat for grizzly bears.

- □ Take to the water with a <u>chartered boat tour</u> to see some of British Columbia's spectacular coastal scenery, along with orcas, Stellar sea lions, seals, river otters, humpback whales and Pacific white-sided dolphins - as well as some of the world' best fishing grounds for halibut and salmon.
- □ Follow game trails with a <u>guided eco-tour</u> <u>operator</u> to find wildlife including wolves, bobcat, mink, fox, deer, bears, bighorn sheep and mountain goats in their natural habitat.
- Quest for the Top add some more brag to your bucket list with these <u>natural wonders</u>:
  - Great Bear Rainforest planet's largest coastal rainforest
  - Quesnel Lake World's deepest fjord lake
  - Chilko Lake North America's largest high-altitude lake



- Cariboo Mountains Provincial Park only inland temperature rainforest in North America
- □ Chilcotin Grasslands last intact grasslands on the planet
- Hunlen Falls Canada's third-highest single-drop waterfall
- Mount Waddington BC's highest mountain peak
- □ Tweedsmuir Provincial Park BC's largest provincial park

## Discover a Road Less Travelled

- □ Tour the <u>Gold Rush Trail</u>. Retrace history following the path of gold seekers, following the mighty Fraser River through the Fraser Valley and continuing on to Barkerville Historic Town & Park [https://www.barkerville.ca/].
- □ Travel <u>Chilcotin Highway 20</u>. Stretching westward from the Cariboo plateau to the shores of Bella Coola, travel through pristine and varied wilderness, stopping at sporadic communities to take in small-town charm.
- □ Cast a line on <u>BC's Fishing Highway 24</u>. At only 97 km (60 mi) long, BC's famed "fishing highway" is a short but exceptionally scenic route offering anglers the chance to dip into nearly 100 crystal clear lakes. Don't fish? Kayak, canoe, SUP, or hike the shoreline of this serene and scenic area.
- See the sights on Highway 40 (Carpenter Lake Road). Travel 105km (65 mi) from Lillooet through breathtaking scenery from arid canyons, the Bridge River Gorge, along turquoise Carpenter Lake, ending deep in the Coast Mountains at the historic settlements of Gold Bridge.
- ☐ Journey along the <u>Likely-Barkerville Back Road</u>. Take the slower road from Likely to Barkerville on this wilderness trek through the Cariboo Mountains, complete with waterfalls, lush valleys and flower-strewn alpine meadows.
